#4 PUBLIC EXPRESSION

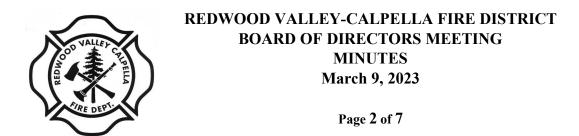

#6 MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

a. For the month of January our total revenue was \$5,277.65 and total expenditures were \$42,058.51 leaving the District with a deficit of \$-36,780.86 for the month. The County did close their books for the 2021/2022 fiscal year, one notable item was the Prop 172 revenue was slightly higher than anticipated, although we do not have that number available in our books. Our bookkeeping firm has not yet had the chance to enter and reconcile the numbers that were just provided by the County.

Expenditures for the month of February as well as the December/January Cal Card charges were outlined. The majority of the expenditures on the Cal Card were related to strike team activity that is reimbursable to the District. There were a couple of accidental charges made by the Chief for personal items that he will reimburse the District for.

- 61 Calls for the month of January with a year-to-date total of 124 calls.
- RVCFD held its annual Sweetheart Awards Dinner
- We have received some new equipment this month, BK5000 radios and Seek Thermal Imaging Cameras. These new items are going to help us better serve the community.
- Chief attended a recent training and it highlighted a different way to look at incident loss and gains. Pointing out that by containing a fire to the kitchen the loss was only the kitchen cost and the savings was the value for the remainder of the house.

a. Second reading of Ordinance 2023-1, by Title only, to adopt the 2022 California Fire Code as amended,

AN ORDINANCE OF THE REDWOOD VALLEY-CALPELLA FIRE DISTRICT ADOPTING THE 2022 EDITION OF THE CALIFORNIA FIRE CODE WITH AMENDMENTS, AS WELL AS NFPA 1 CHAPTER 38, REGULATING AND GOVERNING THE SAFEGUARDING OF LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM FIRE AND EXPLOSION AND FOR PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS.

Question was posed by Director Board regarding the appeals process referring to an ex-officio member. FM Keizer explained that the Fire Code Official was referring to him and that he would be available to the Board for expertise or interpretation of the code but would have no voting authority.

Audience member Gizmo Henderson ask if the Fire District gets notified from the Building Department when there is a red tagged situation or a potential threat issue. FM Keizer said it is not mandated to notify us however that is a relationship that is built between agencies that all work together.

c. Board consideration of official job description of Fire Marshal and proposed stipend. Chief Robinson said he is a firm believer in people be compensated for the work they do. It was brought up at the previous budget meeting to propose a \$500.00/month stipend just like the Training Officer. Director Howard stated he felt that this was operational and could be deferred to the Chief, Director Boyd stated that in the past the Board has approved new job descriptions. Chief Robinson posed some questions regarding FM Keizer's qualifications in light of the job description regarding fire investigations and hazmat. FM Keizer pointed out that as a department we do not preform our own investigations, in the SRA the investigations are preformed by CAL FIRE and in the LRA they are typically done by Battalion Chief Buckingham of Ukiah Valley Fire Authority. That being said FM Keizer highlighted the qualifications and certifications he currently possesses which includes being an ICC certified Fire Marshal. This certification includes several modules one of which is fire investigation, along with many other related certifications and trainings. Over the past two years he has had a little over 400hrs of training half of which is with the State Fire Marshals office. He stated that by bringing up these qualifications he hoped it would help everyone be comfortable with his level of knowledge and training given the position he is in as Fire Marshal. Chief Robinson thanked FM Keizer for his clarification and hopes that eventually this position can eventually be a paid position.

Director Tuso made a motion approve the Fire Marshal job description and the proposed \$500.00/month stipend effective March 1, 2023 with a second by Director Boyd.
